The Vees & Bobby Vee

The band, consisting of brothers Jeff, Tom and Robb, has been together in one form or another for nearly two decades touring from Colorado to New York and points in-between. More recently, as back up band to their father, Bobby Vee, they have traveled throughout the United States and Europe working with such legendary artists as Chuck Berry, Jerry Lee Lewis, Little Richard and Bo Diddley. Rounding out the line up is the accomplished piano talent of George Maurer.



The Vees draw from a wide variety of well known material to put together a high energy rock 'n' roll show that is exciting and original while being an authentic tribute to the legends of rock 'n' roll and their music. Their years of experience as recording and performing artists have resulted in a tight and definitive sound that finds its roots in the early rockabilly music of people such as Elvis, Buddy Holly and Jerry Lee Lewis, but can be as powerful and dynamic as today's rock 'n' roll music.
